## Superintendent's Letter... Emergency School Closing Procedures and Notification

With winter weather approaching, the possibility of


Superintendent David Toth school closings is upon us. Closings due to inclement weather or other emergencies are broadcast on all local radio and television stations. We ask that parents avoid calling the schools or stations since incoming calls tie up phones and delay notification. Decisions on whether or not to close schools due to snow or extreme cold are often difficult since forecasts about if and when bad weather will arrive are often inaccurate. Periodically, forecasts are definitive enough that school can be called off in time for the nightly news. Most of the time, however, the decision is based on reports from district supervisors who are assigned the task of driving our roads between 4 a.m. and 5 a.m. on the days that bad weather is forecast. We attempt to contact all TV stations as early as we can so that parents can get the information they need in a timely manner. In addition to snow, wind chill factors can also be a determining factor. A wind chill of more than 15 degrees below zero brings consideration for closing school due to the large number of students that wait outdoors for buses in our district. Safety is our greatest concern! The most difficult situation is when bad weather arrives immediately after the decision is made to keep

schools open. In such cases, we respect the right of parents to make their own decisions based on neighborhood road and weather conditions. If it becomes necessary to make up school days, the school calendar may be amended using hours at the end of the school year.

An additional tool called Black Board Connect may also be used to contact parents who are part of that system. If you did not sign-up for the Black Board Connect system please contact your child's principal for details.

Living in Northeastern Ohio presents our school district with many challenges dealing with adverse weather. Often, severe conditions at 6 a.m. are much improved one or two hours later making it safe to continue school activities. With this being said - our school district may use the option of a "two-hour delay" start to the school day for inclement weather or other emergencies. By using the "two-hour delay", we may be able to have school and avoid making up any school hours.

The need to close or delay the opening of our schools for the safety of students and staff is a decision we take very seriously. We understand students are better served both academically and socially by being in school, however, student and staff welfare is our top priority.

The following procedures will be implemented for a twohour delay start situation:

Two-Hour Delay Procedures (if Needed)
The superintendent, in conjunction with other school officials, will strive to make a decision by 6 a.m. to either close or delay the opening of school and will announce it to the radio and television media and send out a Blackboard Connect message as in the past.

When a two-hour delay announcement is made, continue to listen to the radio and television for updated information. If conditions deteriorate, a decision will be made to close school for the day by 7:45 a.m. and you will receive a Blackboard Connect call.

## Information, Questions, and Answers for Parents \& Employees

Two-Hour Delay Schedule May Be Used
A "two-hour" delay may be used as an alternative to cancelling school if it can be done safely. Safety is our first priority! Two hour delays will be considered if weather forecasts and local road departments indicate thatroads can be adequately cleared in time for a "late-start" and that safe weather conditions are likely throughout the remainder of the day. We ask you to please make arrangements for your children for the possibility of two hour delays as well as for full-day school closings.

In Crestwood, under a two-hour delay, each building's schedule will begin two hours later than usual. The day will start with the corresponding class period of the day unless communicated otherwise by individual building principals. The school day will end at the usual time.

Transportation changes will be made as follows:
All morning pick-up times for Crestwood public and nonpublic school students will be two hours later than normal. If your student participates in the Education Alternatives, ALS, LEAP, or Maplewood programs(s) this will also apply.

Afternoon transportation home will be at the regular time.
Transportation will not be provided for the morning preschool program since it will be cancelled. It will be provided for the afternoon pre-school program at the regular times.

## Questions and Answers

Can I drop my child off at the regular time if we are on a two hour delay?

No. Building staff will notbe available to supervise students before the designated starting time.

Can we arrange for alternate pick-up locations when there are two hour delays?

No. We cannot change pick-up locations in such a short period of time without compromising safety or causing busses to be late.

Will my child have breakfast or lunch on this schedule? Lunch will be served, but breakfast will not be served.
How will we be notified of two-hour delays or school closing?

As with school closings, the announcement of a two-hour delay will be broadcast on television and radio stations and via our Blackboard Connect telephone system.

What if I believe it is safer to keep my child home all day when schools are open?

District decisions regarding calamity days are made based on safety conditions for the district as a whole. We realize there may be localized conditions that may cause some parents to be concerned. Parents who keep their students home based on localized conditions should send a written excuse the next day and students will be excused and allowed to make up any missed work for credit.

Area weather forecasts are monitored regularly throughout the late evening and early morning hours. District employees drive as many main and back-roads as possible between 4:00 AM and 5:45 AM to monitor depth of snow, drifting, wind, and slipperiness of roads. We also consult as
needed with the State Highway Patrol and other area safety forces.

Our goal is to make parents aware of our decisions to close or delay between 5:45 AM and 6:15 AM if at all possible.

Impact of Two Hour Delays on Employee Schedules
Administrators and custodians will report at the regular time to assist as needed.

All other classified employees who are scheduled for mornings will report two hours later than usual. This applies to secretaries unless other arrangements are made with their principals or direct supervisors out of necessity.

Classified employees who are normally scheduled to work mid-day or afternoon shifts will report at their regular times.

Teachers will report two hours later than their normal times.
Closing or delaying school is a difficult decision and we do our best to make the correct call. Your continued support and cooperation is appreciated.

 Note From The Nurse... RECALL: AuviQ Epinephrine Injector

People who have severe allergies to food, insect stings or latex are often prescribed an epinephrine autoinjector to treat a life threatening reaction (anaphylaxis). Many people are familiar with the brand Epipen but there is also a generic epinephrine autoinjector and one called AuviQ which is a credit card sized device that speaks the instructions to guide the user in properly injecting the medication.

The Food and Drug Administration advises that the manufacturer of AuviQ is voluntarily recalling all of its epinephrine injections because patients taking it for lifethreatening anaphylaxis may receive an inaccurate or inadequate dose. The agency said that patients using AuviQ should ask their healthcare provider to prescribe another brand of epinephrine. They further advise, that in the meantime, if patients experience anaphylaxis, they should only use AuviQ if no other epinephrine autoinjector is available and then seek emergency medical care. Call your healthcare provider if you or a family member have been prescribed AuviQ.

As a reminder, if you have a child who has a severe allergy that may need to be treated with an antihistamine and/or epinephrine injection, please inform your school nurse. We will need a medication authorization and also ask that the healthcare provider complete an allergy action plan which can be followed at school and on school sponsored activities or trips.

CMS Opens Writing Center Staffed by Students


The CMS Writing Center is open for business! Fourteen eighth grade writing coaches are excited to begin working with student writers following their recent training session modeled on the Kent State University Writing Commons Philosophy which focuses on using active listening skills and asking specific questions to engage the student writers. Students increase their understanding of their assignments and their drafts, and can then make revisions on their own. Currently, sixth and seventh grade students have the opportunity to work with an eighth grade writing coach in the library during the study hall portion of their Academic Enrichment period. When the Hiram College
 students arrive to begin their field experience at the middle school, they will coach our eighth grade writers.

Mrs. Anfang and Mrs. Kulesza attended the KEEP (Kent Education Excellence Partnership) academy, a consortium of local schools, where they learned about implementing a Writing Center at the middle school level. As part of a collaborative inquiry project through Kent State University, Mrs. Anfang and Mrs. Kulesza will be collecting data on the writing center, coordinating the coaches and student writers, and giving a presentation at Tallmadge High School in the spring. In addition, they attended a"Writing Center Development" session conducted by and within the Kent State University Writing Commons. A pilot program began at CMS in January with the Hiram College students as writing coaches for sixth, seventh, and eighth graders.

Now our eighth grade coaches are ready! They have completed a training on the Writing Center "Golden Rules," the role of a writing coach, and how to create a conference plan. They have viewed model session videos and participated in mock sessions using actual (anonymous) student writing samples. They are ready, willing, and able to help any sixth or seventh grader during 6B or 6C in the library on Tuesdays and Thursdays.
