Sixteen Crestwood music students and two community members recently attended the Wooster Music Camp July 13-17 on the campus of the College of Wooster. This was a five-day camp for students in grades 6-12 who participated in day and evening activities that included band and orchestra rehearsals, concerts, and enrichment opportunities such as music theory, African drumming, choir, talent shows, recitals, skits, jazz band and recreation. The faculty consisted of 35 exceptional music teachers from Ohio and beyond, including Lieutenant Colonel (Retired) Frank Dubuy, United States Army, who has conducted Pershing's Own, The US Army Field Band and Chorus, the Military Academy Band at West Point, and is currently teaching at Grand Canyon University, Phoenix, AZ.

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Related Services Provide Needed Services to Crestwood Students

Crestwood Schools has three Speech-Language Pathologists (SLPs) who perform a variety of jobs for our students. Speech-Language Pathologists assess, diagnosis and treat communication disorders.

In the school setting, SLPs work on skills such as vocabulary, sentence structure, articulation (sound production), hearing and listening skills, stuttering, and social skills. In addition, they provide routine hearing screenings for kindergarten. Speech Language Pathologists also collaborate with classroom teachers and parents to support students' communication skills in the educational setting.

Crestwood's SLPs are Kathy Lamb, Julie Sandish, and Anne Williams. Miss Sandish joined Crestwood's team of SLPs this year. Miss Sandish serves students at Crestwood Intermediate School and Crestwood Middle School. This is Mrs. Williams fourth year with Crestwood Schools, and she provides services to students at Crestwood Primary School and Crestwood Middle School. Mrs. Lamb has been with Crestwood for thirty years and serves Crestwood Preschool, Crestwood



High School, and the Crestwood classroom at the Hattie Larham Center. All Crestwood's SLPs hold a Master's degree and are licensed by the state of Ohio Board of Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology and the Ohio Department of Education. In addition, all Crestwood SLPs are involved in various professional organizations related to Speech Language Pathology.

Crestwood Local Schools Levy Updates

It's hard to believe it is time to talk about levies this soon. The District currently has two levies that will be placed on the ballot for renewal. The levies are as follows:

Renewal Levy – 4.7 Mill Emergency Levy – Originally passed in 2012. This levy collects \$1,400,000 annually for the District and is a 4 year levy. This levy will be placed on the ballot in May of 2015. This is a renewal levy and will not increase taxes.

Renewal Levy – 3.5 Mill Permanent Improvement Levy – Originally passed in 1987. This levy collects \$450,000 annually for the District and is a 5 year levy. This levy will be placed on the ballot in November 2016. This is a renewal levy and will not increase taxes.

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Crestwood Schools In Good Financial Shape - Part II

In the August issue of Crestwood Comments I presented the Fiscal Year end balances in a few of our major funds, general fund expenditures and a snap shot of the May Five Year forecast. While the District is good financial shape for the next few years there are three areas of concern that could have a potentially negative impact on the District finances. The first area of concern is continued deficit spending. While the District will see a positive balance for the 2014-2015 fiscal year, the remaining years of the forecast period, Fiscal Years 2016 through Fiscal Year 2019, show deficit spending. This means the District is annually spending more than it is receiving in revenue for those years. The District's cash balance will continue to be spent to make up for those deficits. It will take much work from the Administration to ensure the annual spending is as close to zero or positive for future years and ensure the District's cash balance remains.

The second and third areas of concern are declining enrollment and the "guarantee." As we enter the 2014-2015 school year, the Department of Education is implementing a new enrollment count. In the past, a snapshot of enrollment was taken the first full week in October and that snapshot determined the District's state funding for the year. This school year the Department of Education has implemented three enrollment count periods. The first one will occur in October, the second one will occur in March and the third one will occur in June. These new count periods will allow districts to see increases or decreases in funding throughout the year as enrollment increases or decreases. Crestwood's enrollment has seen declines again for the 2014-2015 school year by approximately 70.

As I have mentioned in past articles, the District is on a "guarantee" in state funding. The State of Ohio prepares a two year budget (July 1, 2013 through June 30, 2015) and included in this budget is the funding for education in Ohio. The reality of the state funding was the District is currently on a 36% "Guarantee." A guarantee means the State of Ohio

will guarantee the District they will pay them what they got in the previous year. It also means that the State of Ohio feels the District should not be getting 36% of the revenue it received in the previous year, but will pay or "guarantee" the District in a good faith effort. Currently 190 school districts (out of 615) are on the guarantee. Since the District is on such a large guarantee, increases and decreases in enrollment will only place us further on the guarantee or pull us slowly off of the guarantee. There has been indications by the Governor's office that the guarantee will eventually go away for Districts, but there is no indication when this will happen or by how much.


In the Spring of 2015, the Ohio Legislature will begin formulating the next biennial budget, for

the period of July 1, 2015 through June 30, 2017. The District will have a good indication in June 2015 what the state funding, and more importantly what the "guarantee" funding, will look like. As the District moves forward in the coming years, cautious spending and further knowledge of how changes at the State level will affect the District will need continuous monitoring and communication.

Facilities Update



On July 7, 2014 the District opened sealed bids for paving repair, seal coating and striping of the District's parking lots. A local company was awarded the bid. This company has been working since late July with many rain delays.

When finished the District will have repaired approximately 16,000 sq ft of asphalt and sealed coated approximately 470,000 sq ft of parking lots.

The money used to complete this project came from the permanent improvement fund, the maintenance fund and the building maintenance fund for the Primary and Intermediate buildings.

Crestwood Shows Improvement on State Report Card

No Score Below a “C”

The state of Ohio released District Report Cards in mid-September. Crestwood saw growth in just about every category rated. Currently the state is reporting grades on Achievement, Progress, Gap Closing, and Graduation Rate. In 2016 the State will add K-3 Literacy and Prepared for Success, an indicator of college readiness. Here's a summary of Crestwood's performance.

Achievement

The Achievement score measures both how many students passed the state test and how many indicators the district met. This year, the District performed slightly higher on the number of students passing the test than last year, giving the District a “B” with 84% passing. The “Indicator” rating takes into account each test in all the grade levels and measures how the students perform compared to a base-line of 80%, which is the state and district goal. The district met 20 out of 24 indicators, meaning that of the 24 tests given to students grade 3-8, and 10 and 11, the students scored 80% or better on 20 of these tests. The rating of “B” in this category is lower than the 2012-2013 school year. This is due to the states increasing the requirements from 75% of students scoring proficient to 80% of students scoring proficient.

Gap Closing

This rating measures how well all students are doing in the District regardless of income, race, ethnicity or disability. The District showed the largest growth in this category compared to last year, moving from an “F” to a “C”.

Progress

The progress rating measures how each individual student performs from year to year and measures whether they are making a year's worth of growth. The District received an overall rating of a “B” and in the subcategories of Gifted students, Students with Disabilities and Students Performing in the Lowest 20% of Achievement, the District scored a rating of “C” in each. This is an improvement from last year where the District's overall rating was a “C”. This means most of the students at Crestwood are demonstrating a year's worth of growth academically.

Graduation Rate

The final rating is Graduation Rate. This looks at how many students graduate in four years or five years. The District's score improved to an “A” in the four year rating with 93.8% of the students graduating in 4 years. This is an increase of approximately 3% from last year. The District earned a “B” in the number of students graduating in 5 years.



Students Explore the World with New Chromebooks

Note From The Nurses... Healthcare Planning

Many students have health concerns that require a Healthcare Action Plan so staff can help keep them safe at school. Some of these health concerns are severe allergies to food or insect stings, asthma, seizures and diabetes.

Food/Insect Sting Allergies

Some students have food or insect sting allergies that can cause a localized rash, hives or itching. These children may need an antihistamine at school to help with these symptoms. However, some individuals can have a life threatening anaphylactic reaction which can cause death. These students should carry an epipen at school and have a back-up epipen in the clinic.

Asthma

Student with asthma often take a controller medication daily at home to prevent the symptoms of asthma. Many need to use a rescue inhaler (ventolin, albuterol, xopenex) for asthma flare-ups. Students are permitted to carry and self administer rescue inhalers or keep them in the clinic to use when needed provided the appropriate permission form is submitted.

Seizures

Students with a known seizure disorder may need medication to be given for a prolonged seizure. This is only

given by the school nurse.

Diabetes

Students are required to have a current diabetes care plan for school from the physician who manages the diabetes.

If our health records indicate that your child has any of the above concerns, you will be sent a Healthcare Action Plan so that the Crestwood nurses can provide individualized care for each student. This Healthcare Action Plan should be completed by the child's healthcare provider. In addition, if your child needs to have prescription medication at school (Ex: epipen, inhaler, diastat, insulin) we will need an authorization completed and signed by the healthcare provider and the parent/guardian for each medication. If an over the counter medicine is needed, an authorization must be completed by the parent/guardian only.

Your physician's office can mail or fax completed forms to the school nurse. Please be sure you have signed your section before giving it to them. Fax numbers vary by building. Please call your child's building secretary for the address or fax number.

Children may have other health problems that the nurse should be aware of and that may require interventions at school. Please call the school nurse if you have any questions about any health concerns. We are here to help your child be a successful learner.

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Intermediate School Title One Math Program – An Opportunity of Support

Most educators, parents and community members have heard the term Title 1. Title 1 is one of the nation's oldest and largest federally funded educational programs, according to the U.S. Department of Education. Originally, the idea of Title 1 was enacted in 1965 under the Elementary and Secondary Education Act. This policy committed to closing the achievement gap between low-income students and other students.

Title 1 is a Federal aid program through which most Ohio school districts receive funding to provide supplemental instruction for those students who qualify. The allocation of funds for each school district is based on a legislative formula dependent upon the distribution of low-income children and state per-pupil expenditures.

The purpose of Title 1 funding "is to ensure that all children have a fair, equal, and significant opportunity to obtain a high quality education and reach, at minimum, proficiency on challenging state academic achievement standards and state academic assessments. Title 1 Math seeks to provide additional learning opportunities, individualized support and alternative instructional strategies.

This math program, offered only at the Crestwood Intermediate School, gives students the opportunity to receive additional Math support. Title 1 services in Math are provided for ALL children who qualify as needing assistance regardless of income. The program is conducted during the regular school year and is dedicated to serving students in grades 3, 4 and 5. The instructor assigned to this program, Mr. Reink, has over 30 years of experience in education.

The Title 1 program is designed as a limited pullout program, in which students are removed from their classrooms for a limited period of time for intensive instruction.

In the Title 1 Math Program, we strive to increase the proficiency of identified students in grades three, four, and five in the following areas:

1. Computation, Addition, Subtraction, Multiplication and Division

2. Problem Solving

3. Performance Tasks

It is our expectation that children who receive Title 1 Math services will be able to achieve closer to their individual potential which will result in improved basic math skills and hopefully future success.

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
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Rotary and High School Partner in Round #2 Of the Best Chili Cook Off Ever!
