Crestwood Student Performance Used for National Report Card Data

Students from Crestwood Intermediate School and Crestwood Middle School have been selected to participate in the National Assessment of Educational Progress. The U.S. Department of Education selected sixty-three Crestwood Intermediate School fourth grade students to represent Ohio and the Nations grade four students on the National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP). A select group of seventh grade students will also participate.

The National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP) is the largest nationally representative assessment of what our nation's students know and can do. In 2013 Ohio students will be assessed in

reading and mathematics. The results of NAEP are released as The Nation's Report Card, and are available for the nation, states, and for large districts participating in the Trial Urban District Assessment (TUDA). NAEP is currently the only measure that allows for valid comparisons of student performance to be made across states. NAEP is considered the gold standard of assessments because of its high technical quality. The students from CIS completed the NAEP on January 30, 2013. Board of Education Interviewing for New Superintendent

"The biggest reason for wanting a POS system efficiency," Jill is states Treasurer/CFO Rowe. of Crestwood Local School District. According to Rowe, the District spends a great manually deal of time entering cafeteria information necessary to participate in State and Federal reduced lunch programs. A pointof-sale which system, includes the use of student scan cards, would greatly reduce the hours spent in data-entry. As Rowe sees it, the use of scan cards will eliminate the stigma that keeps some students from taking advantage of free or reduced-price lunches.

In addition to streamlining breakfast and lunch purchases, the system would allow parents and guardians to pay class fees, along with sports and activities charges, online with a credit card. Parents would also be able to load money onto their children's scan cards to pay for healthy lunches, to specify food allergies and other pertinent information.

The District began looking at POS systems in January and planned to purchase a system with Permanent Improvement Funds. However, recently, the District identified and applied for a Federal Grant available through the Department of Education as a more effective alternative to pay for such expenditures. Since Crestwood is one of few

Crestwood Collaborates with Mantua Village on Waste Disposal Project

A partnership between the Village of Mantua and Crestwood Schools will make it possible for the school to eliminate the pump station on middle school property and allow the city to extend sewer services to residents on John Edward Drive. Both partners have applied for grants to offset some of the cost.

The current pump station on the middle school property is old, out-dated and in need of constant maintenance. It currently pumps waste from the building up the hill, past the High School and into a line on S.R. 44. lacano said the cost to replace the station is estimated at \$138,000.

The district and village started working together a year ago to come up with a better, gravity-based solution. By installing a direct line and connecting it to the sewer line on Mennonite, this can be accomplished.

The cost to the district for this joint initiative will be capped at \$138,000, or the cost of replacing the old pump station. The district has also obtained a "Shared Services" grant from the Ohio Development Services Agency for \$21,500, further reducing the district's cost. The Village's cost will be covered completely by a grant from the Ohio Public Works Commission.

Preliminary engineering for the project is scheduled to begin in April 2013.

Group objectives may involve: social

skills, following directions, organizing verbal and written responses, and self-regulation of behavior and sensory needs. Special interest



groups (Legos) and Lunch Bunch provide students with opportunities for interactions outside the classroom setting. This combined approach for our students' education is "best practice for our kids!"




