New Ohio Graduation Requirements

· American history and American government

• English I and English II

Students studying Advanced Placement (AP), International Baccalaureate (IB) or taking dual enrollment courses in physical science, American history or American government may take assessments aligned to those courses in lieu of end-of-course exams to avoid double testing.

And meet one of the following three:

1. Earn a cumulative passing score on seven end-of-course exams. The scores will be set by the State Board of Education.

2. Earn a "remediation-free" score on a nationally recognized college admission exam such as ACT or SAT. The state of Ohio will pay for all 11th grade students to take the exam free of charge.

3. Earn a State Board of Education-approved, industry-recognized credential or a state-issued license for practice in a career and achieve a score that demonstrates workforce readiness and employability on a job skills assessment.

Crestwood Schools In Good Financial Shape



It is often funny to me when the comment is made "Have a good summer." Many individuals do not know that the Treasurer's Office works year around and the summer is our busiest time during the year. Summer time in the Treasurer's Office brings year-end closing, summer ordering for the school year, entering new contracts and salary notices for the staff, and processing free and reduced applications, just to name a few of the yearly processes that occur in the Treasurer's Office during the summer months.

This summer we ended Fiscal Year 2014 and began Fiscal Year 2015. Below is a snap shot of how the Fiscal Year 2014 ended in a few of our major funds:

The next chart represents the Fiscal Year 2014 General Fund Expenditures by Category.



As we can see from the charts above the General Fund ended the year with a balance of \$2,321,206. This ending balance is slightly higher then what was estimated on the May



Five Year Forecast by \$94,976. Salaries and Benefits are 79% of the total general fund expenditures, while purchased services and supplies and materials, capital outlay, debt and other make up the remaining 21% of the total general fund expenditures.

Due to some recent retirements and declining enrollment, the staff was reduced by three and one half $(3\frac{1}{2})$ individuals through attrition. This swing in payroll and benefits saved the District approximately \$400,000 per year. The next table is a snap shot of the May Five Year Forecast which reflects these savings:

There is still much work to be done relating to the finances and becoming financially stable for years into the future.

District 5-year Strategic Plan Underway

Last school year we began planning for a 5-year strategic plan. We held monthly leadership meetings including staff and community members. We conducted surveys, and held community focus groups. As a result of these efforts we've come up with five overall goals. These goals will be further refined into action plans throughout the 2014-2015 school year. Our five goals are:

Communication Plan

Increase effective communication with all stakeholders within the Crestwood community. The five-year Communication Plan will be presented to the Board of Education by September, 2014. This Communication Plan will reflect a 10% increase in community feedback by June 2020. The Plan will address consistent back and forth timely communication between the District and constituents that meets the concerns of the Crestwood community.

Facilities Plan

To continue upgrades that will enable 21st Century Learning for Crestwood students. By June 2015 a five-year Facilities Plan will be presented to the Board of Education. Additionally, the Facility Plan will address establishing community-wide connections that integrates school life to all stakeholders. By June 2020, we will have 100% completion of the Facilities Plan. Periodic reviews/evaluations will be done with final evaluation by June 2020.

Blueprint Career and College Pathways

In order for all students of Crestwood Local School District to become contributing and successful citizens upon exiting the District, the District will develop a blueprint for Career and College Pathways by June 2015. A draft blueprint will be presented to the Board of Education by February 2015. By June, 2020 100% of all students will have identified written pathway options.

Technology Plan

By January 2015, the District will have a draft five-year Technology Plan and a final five-year Plan to be in place by June 2015. The Plan will be reviewed periodically with the Board of Education with a final evaluation by June 2015, which minimally addresses increase of 5% of student instructional time utilizing various forms of current technology reflecting real world usage.

Curriculum and Instruction Plan

In order to provide every student a quality education, a

Curriculum and Instruction Plan will be developed by January 2015. The Plan will address learning opportunities (curriculum materials, pedagogy, collaboration, internships, mentoring, project-based learning, etc.) that meet the needs of the student. One hundred percent effectiveness based upon the unique abilities of each student will be met by June 2020.

It's hard to believe it is time to talk about levies this soon. The District currently has two levies that will be placed on the ballot for renewal. The levies are as follows:

Renewal Levy – 4.7 Mill Emergency Levy – Originally passed in 2012. This levy collects \$1,400,000 annually for the District and is a 4 year levy. This levy will be placed on the ballot in May of 2015. This is a renewal levy and will not increase taxes.

Renewal Levy – 3.5 Mill Permanent Improvement Levy – Originally passed in 1987. This levy collets \$450,000 annually for the District and is a 5 year levy. This levy will be placed on the ballot in November 2016. This is a renewal levy and will not increase taxes.
